



#Metoo two years later....

EUROPEAN OBSERVATORY ON SEXISM AND SEXUAL HARASSMENT AT WORK

On the occasion of the anniversary of the eruption of the Weinstein affair (5 October 2017) and the many similar allegations it triggered in all sectors of activity, the Jean Jaurès Foundation and the Foundation for European Progressive Studies (FEPS) launched a major survey conducted by Ifop (French Institute for Public Opinion) to measure the extent of sexist or sexual violence suffered by European women at their workplaces. Filling a gap in reliable or recent data on the subject – the last European study on the subject dates back to 2012¹ – this survey conducted in the five biggest countries of the European Union (France, Germany, Spain, Italy, United Kingdom) makes it possible to quantify sexism or sexual harassment suffered by women in the professional realm while breaking certain stereotypes about victims' characteristics or the profile of their harassers.
