- Is the digital investment used to expand access to health and education?
- To what extent are the NRRPs investing in future generations by promoting early childhood education and care?

These are some of the questions that this Recovery Watch conference will be addressing.

The <u>Recovery Watch</u> is a research project led by FEPS, the *Friedrich Ebert Stiftung* (FES) and the *Institut Emile Vandervelde* (IEV), in collaboration with several research organisations.
