

4TH FEPS ANNUAL AUTUMN ACADEMY

For a Youthful Future of Europe!

Since its inception in 2019, the FEPS Annual Autumn Academy (FEPS AAA) has evolved becoming a flagship training activity and a strong reference point within the FEPS Training Strategy. FEPS AAA is eagerly awaited every year as the event that marks an opening of a new political season. It is the occasion to connect Brussels's most promising young progressives from across the EU and the key stakeholders (politicians, academics, trade unionists, civil society representatives and diverse experts). Through good practice, it consolidated a unique FEPS AAA methodology, which, as László Andor, FEPS Secretary General, says "allows to teach effectively in three days a content equal to what is provided within an academic semester". The ambition is always to accelerate and reach new levels of excellence, and the 4th edition was not exempted from that goal. The programme was developed in a way that would build on a specific EU momentum (European Year of Youth) and provide yet another innovation regarding the training methods.



Consequently, the leading title was "For a Youthful European Future", referring to a junction of two reflections – about the further prospects of the European integration on one hand, and on the other about the dreams that young generations of Europeans cherish and the expectations they have when it comes to the EU. This approach meant that the FEPS AAA would aim at looking at the European youth policies from the perspective of what role they play in making the Union rise to its historical promise of providing peace, stability, and prosperity on the continent and beyond. These predefined the sub-topics around which we organised each day of the programme. They respectively referred to the empowerment and involvement of young people, to connect diverse generations' agendas in the name of perpetual and socially just

progress, as also to connect the stakeholders within the institutional system with the young cohorts in an attempt to create a coalition for a progressive change.



As mentioned before, the programme was built based on the FEPS AAA Methodology Toolbox. This meant that the learning path was designed as a mix between inputs and interactive moments, between the focus on research and the insight into politics and between theory and practical exercises. Similarly to the previous years, a great effort went into making the programme exceptional, innovative and providing enough space for networking. And with that promise, FEPS reached out to the FEPS Members with an open invitation to support the search for this year's nominees – who would be the most promising, young progressive politicians from across the Union. With the Network's support, it was possible to welcome almost 50 of them for the four days in Brussels (between $23^{rd} - 26^{th}$ October 2022).



Furthermore, FEPS has had the privilege to count yet again on sister organisations, who contributed to the organisation of the programme (also involving their respective teams' members), hosted some of the debates (see visits to the S&D Group in the European Parliament, to the EESC and the PES in CoR, and to the PES) and also were represented by their respective leaders, who spoke during the event. As a result of incredibly valuable cooperation FEPS was proud to have welcome Iraxte García Pérez, S&D Group President – who has been generous and involved personally in each of the editions, alongside Katarina Barley, EP and PES Vice-president; Andreas Schieder, MEP and Chair of Next Left and GPF; Alicia Homs, YES President and MEP; Mohammed Chahim, S&D Group Vice President; João Duarte Albuquerque, MEP; Javi López, MEP and Chair of PES Climate Change and Environment Network; Victor Negrescu, MEP and PES Vice President, Brando Benifei, MEP and Head of Italian delegation; Estrella Durá, MEP; Alex Agius Saliba, S&D Group Vice presiden; Domènec Ruiz Devesa, MEP and Matthias Ecke, MEP. It was an honour to welcome also Zita Gurmai, PES Women President (who held the keynote), to be received by Oliver Röpke, President of the Worker's Group at the EESC, as also Jamila Madeira, MP and International Secretary of PS Portugal, Agnieszka Dziemianowicz-Bak and Katarzyna Ueberhan, MPs; Ana Pirtskhalava, YES Secretary General, and Konrad Golota, PES Advisor for CEE. As also, to hear from several current and former Ministers, who made a special appearance: Ann Linde, former Swedish Foreign Minister and Christie Morreale, Minister for Employment of Wallonia.



To that end, FEPS AAA counted, as on very generous FEPS Scientific Council Members (Professor Andre Gerrits, Professor Jernej Pikalo); FEPS Bureau and Team Members; on FEPS YAN and their alumni (Dominic Afscharian, Marene Eigershuizen, Tomás Vieira Silva, Dimitro Mamayev), on leaders of the FEPS Member Foundations (especially Bartosz Rydliński and Kido

Koening for speaking at the event), and broad FEPS Network* All these stakeholders' involvement was key to success and to the determination to provide a complete set of diverse views on this year's topic.



Typically, already for the FEPS AAA the important moments were the lectures, which this time concerned intergenerational solidarity (with Jorge Gallindo, Adjunct Director of EsadeEcPol) and youth and Euroscepticism (with Daphne Halikiopoulou, Professor of the University of Reading). Additionally, the participants could benefit from a Special Guest Appearance by Paul Magnette, Leader of PS – who had recently published a book "La vie Large" and offered a talk about eco-socialism, which inspired an intense debate about the future of progressivism. These also transcended into the two discussions, which followed the launch of the two new FEPS primers – on EU Trade Policies by Arancha González Laya (Dean of PSIA at Science PO) and on EU Climate and Environmental Policies by Stephen Minas (Associate Professor at the School of Transnational Law, Peking University).







Also, traditionally already, the programme envisaged ways that help to balance in between providing knowledge, insights and skills. These were, respectively:

- Debates (on the war in Ukraine, on youth unemployment, on young people and the "Future of Europe").
- Three country-case studies workshops (on the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal).
- Three thematic workshops (on youth and mental health, on EU mobility, on EU volunteering).
- Three masterclasses (on voting age 16 with Anna Colombo, former Secretary General of S&D Group; on communicating youth policies with Dan Luca, Vice President of Strategic Innovations at Euroactiv; and empowering young women in politics with Claire Reynolds, Chair of Labour Women Network).



As the FEPS AAA is an initiative that is to equip and empower, this year, the absolute novelty was designed to strengthen the latter. It was aimed at providing a boost in the dimension that invited FEPS AAA nominees to work creatively. For that reason, the idea of so-called "Future Workshop" was introduced and adapted to the programme with the help of three incredible facilitators and trainers: Kido Koenig, Larissa Lojc and Eric Sundström. The FEPS AAA Future Workshop followed the philosophy of being a process of 3 stages (critical, idealistic, pragmatic), during each of which FEPS AAA nominees worked in 3 working groups (devoted to equality, solidarity and democracy) and there could also benefit from the inputs of external speakers. The process ended with drafting

a declaration, which was then presented and adopted at the final ceremony. But beyond that, as the methodology has become such a powerful, crafted one – it has become a new item of the FEPS AAA (and by extension FEPS Training) Toolkit, where it remains available to FEPS members and partners to be used further.

Last but not least, the success of the FEPS AAA is determined by its impact on providing high-quality learning and vast networking opportunities. But what makes it additionally exceptional is the number of memorable moments it entails, some of which come down also to engaging in specially designed FEPS AAA EU Treasure Hunt, FEPS Red Sofa Discussion (addition of 2022), FEPS AAA "Pub Quiz" on History of Social Democracy and FEPS AAA Bingo.

Altogether, the 4th FEPS AAA rounded up to be – in a good tradition of the initiative – the best, the most innovative and influential edition so far. While it provided an outstanding programme, it was yet again conducted with an ambition to accelerate and reach another level of excellence. And that success is incredibly motivating, as it also stays with the FEPS AAA Team as a sense of responsibility – to look ahead to the semi-jubilee 5th edition and make it even more remarkable, yet again.







