The first step to mainstreaming climate into policy fields consists of understanding sets of normative principles that can bring them together. This first discussion will focus on climate justice principles, and their role in mainstreaming climate in other policy fields, such as health, gender and digital, where a move away from siloed policymaking is proving urgent. Climate justice principles can help allocate the costs and benefits of climate policy regardless of the policy field under scrutiny. In light of the international nature of the climate crisis, an inclusive account of climate justice that does right by emerging economies is imperative, bringing to the fore the global relevance of exploring such principles for policymaking. The discussion fostered within this webinar should help expand upon these conclusions with the inclusion of additional voices, with a specific focus on how policymakers and decisionmakers can use climate justice principles in their work.
