DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND

In Hungary, wealth disparities have widened over the past decade, with the incredible growth of oligarchs linked to the Orban government, while the continued decline of the vulnerable is also present. Government policy is characterised by a redistribution of resources in favour of the wealthy. These policies undermine health systems, public services, environmental protection and the fight against poverty.

Therefore, the Foundation of European Progressive Studies (FEPS) collaborates with the Institute for Social Democracy (Szociális) to boost the “Tax the Rich” European Citizens’ Initiative (ECI) in the Hungarian context to raise public awareness and help collect signatures in Hungary.

“Tax the Rich” aims to tax great wealth to finance the ecological and social transition. If 1 million signatures from citizens across the EU are collected, the European Commission will have to propose legislation on the issue.

This event will be held in Hungarian.
