



Progressive Migration Group Conference in Brussels

Putting African perspectives on the centre stage of EU migration policies

Tuesday 10 September 2024 @FEPS premises (Av. des Arts 46, 1000 Brussels)

In the current global context, migration has once again returned to the top of the European and national political agenda. However, short-term, simplistic and narrow policy responses will not only fail to address existing challenges but will likely exacerbate the consequences of mismanagement. In 2024, the European Union reached a long awaited agreement on the New Pact on Migration and Asylum, which should represent a comprehensive framework for migration management in Europe. Many question marks, however, remain on its implementation and on its capability to ensure the respect of human rights and the EU's increased tendency to outsource migration management to third countries.

Considering the above-mentioned criticalities and the significance of migration as a policy issue in the upcoming European legislative term, the Foundation for European Progressive Studies (FEPS) and the Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung (FES) will continue the crucial work of the Progressive Migration Group. Several online expert meetings in 2024 focused on three key challenges, namely the implications of the EU Asylum reform for the African countries, the shortage of labour migration and legal pathways and the African perspectives on the complex interplay between EU migration and development policy on the continent.

Building on the results of these online exchanges, the in-person meeting in Brussels will discuss recommendations directly with policymakers. This mix of meetings and panel discussions will allow for an open debate with key stakeholders about these critical issues considering diverse viewpoints and challenges. The aim of this meeting is to provide a platform for dialogue on eye level, foster collaboration and discuss policy recommendations addressed to decision-makers in Africa and the EU.
