The green transformation of society is a necessity and a chance for a better, healthier life, but it requires considerable financial resources. However, the financial possibilities of the state are limited. Therefore, the question arises whether we require sufficient financial participation in the costs of the green transformation from those who pollute the environment the most. If we burden people with higher costs, are we doing it fairly according to their ability to manage these expenses? And to what extent does the state have well-set instruments and schemes for compensation and support for "green" investments for those households that cannot afford them themselves? What does the European Citizens' Initiative "Tax the rich" propose?
