Time to build a European digital ecosystem Recommendations for the EU's digital policy

Tuesday, 14 January 2025, 11:30-13:30

Despite its role as the frontrunner in regulating Big Tech, through regulations such as the Digital Services and Markets Act and the AI Act, the European Union is at a crossroads in its digital transformation. Geopolitical tensions and growing reliance on foreign tech giants underscore the urgent need for greater technological sovereignty.

During an expert lunch roundtable, we will discuss the recommendations of our policy study <u>'Time to build a European digital ecosystem'</u>, which outlines critical steps for the EU to reduce digital dependencies and create a resilient, autonomous, and socially inclusive digital framework. The study emphasises the importance of enforcing existing digital regulations and creating a European Digital Industrial Policy to drive innovation and secure European values.

The new European Commission will have to ensure digital gatekeepers like Google and Meta comply with existing legislation – and enforce them when needed. Critical recommendations for the new EC focus on creating a unified digital industrial strategy, including developing a 'EuroStack', a European technology framework encompassing hardware, infrastructure, AI, data, and governance. Achieving digital sovereignty requires a strategic overhaul.
