This unique 60-minute session is organized with a bold ambition to connect diverse conversations about the future of progressivism in Europe. As such, it will offer a space for the presentations of the most intriguing, encouraging and possibly groundbreaking findings of the Next Left Research Programme (est. in 2009), as outlined within the newest, written especially for the occasion pamphlet "Facing the Future – how to make social democracy a powerhouse again". It will be a moment to hear about programmatic proposals, such as the doctrine of Ecosocialism. And it will be an opportunity to become familiar and engaged with the strategy outlined by the S&D Group in its own mission, which is to seek to gather best practices from across the Union and offer a rich repository of them as input to the debate on the movement's renewal. But while the organizers have been honored by a fantastic line-up of confirmed speakers, each of whom will refer respectively to the themes mentioned here, to match the challenge of providing something fresh, they decided on a rather unusual schedule for the event. The framing will ensure that those joining in the capacity of the audience will be guaranteed the primary attention and the right to help shape the debate. That is especially true because the session will feature some digital surprises that will help preserve the key insights and the valuable proposals formulated during the exchange for further inspiration.
