



**László ANDOR** is the Secretary General of FEPS. An economist and former EU Commissioner for Employment, Social Affairs and Inclusion (2010-2014), Andor has been head of the Department of Economic Policy at Corvinus University (Budapest), senior fellow at Hertie School of Governance (Berlin) and a visiting professor at ULB (Brussels) and Sciences Po (Paris). He was the editor of the journal *Eszmélet* and a regular columnist for *Figyelo* and *Népszava*. He has authored, edited or co-edited a dozen books. Andor has also taught at Rutgers University as a Visiting Fulbright Professor, worked as an advisor for the World Bank on SAPRI, the Budget Committee of the Hungarian Parliament (1998-1999) and the prime minister's office (2002-2005), and was also a member of the Board of Directors of the EBRD. He holds a degree in Economic Sciences from Karl Marx (now Corvinus) University, an MA in Development Economics from the University of Manchester and a PhD from the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. He was awarded Doctor Honoris Causa at Sofia University of National and World Economy and the Legion of Honour by the President of France (2014).



**Balázs BÖCSKEI** (1983) is a political scientist and political analyst. He is the strategic director of the IDEA Institute, an assistant professor at the Department of International and Political Science at Milton Friedman University, and a research assistant at the Institute of Political Science at ELTE TK. He is co-editor of numerous political science and election volumes, and his academic publications appear in Hungarian, English and German.



**Céline CHARVERIAT** is the founder and director of Pro(to)topia Consulting, an adjunct professor at the Paris School of International Affairs (PSIA), and part-time programme director of the Vaerekraft Foundation (Norway). She previously spent 15 years at Oxfam International, leading global campaigns on inequality and climate justice, and served as Executive Director of the Institute for European Environmental Policy (2016-2022), where she contributed to the European Green Deal and founded Think2030. She currently chairs Climate Catalyst and advises EU institutions. Her research focuses on new economics, beyond-GDP indicators and green caring societies.



**Daniela HUBER** is an associate professor in the Political Science Department of Roma Tre University where she teaches international relations and is Erasmus Coordinator. She is also a scientific advisor of the International Affairs Institute in Rome and co-editor of *The International Spectator*. She has published two monographs, 22 peer-reviewed academic articles, 10 edited volumes and special issues, as well as 12 book chapters on issues pertaining to international and contemporary politics at the interface of Europe and the Middle East. She has also scientifically coordinated the Horizon 2020 Project MEDRESET and been involved as work packages leader or researcher in numerous other European Commission funded research projects.



**Bruno JEANBART**, Executive Vice President of OpinionWay, is a renowned expert in political and social research with 30 years of experience. A graduate of Sciences Po Paris (1993), he also attended Bath University (UK) for one year of a BSc in economics and politics, as well as completing a master's in sociology at the University of Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne (1994). Since 2006, he has led OpinionWay to become a French leader in social and political research by pioneering internet-based polling. A specialist in electoral issues, he has been developing forecasting models since 2015 and has expanded his research to cover Europe and Africa. As an influential political analyst, he frequently appears on national and international media outlets. **Ana E. JUNCOS GARCIA** is Professor of European Politics at the School of Sociology, Politics and International Studies at the University of Bristol (UK). She is also a visiting professor at the College of Europe in Bruges. Her primary research interest lies in European foreign and security policy, with a particular focus on EU conflict prevention and peace building. She is also known for her work on negotiations in EU foreign policy and populist foreign policy. She is author of *EU Foreign and Security Policy in Bosnia: The Politics of Coherence and Effectiveness* (2013) and co-editor of *EU Conflict Prevention and Crisis Management* (2011). She is currently Editor of the *Journal of European Integration*.



**Hans KEMAN** (1948) is emeritus Professor of Comparative Political Science at the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam (VUA). He lives in Friesland, the northern part of the Netherlands. He read political science and contemporary history at VUA. After being at the University of Amsterdam (1975-1982), he moved to the European University Institute. In 1985, he was an associate professor at Leiden University. In 1990, he was appointed full professor and head of department at the VUA; he retired in 2013. Hans has been a visiting fellow and guest lecturer around the world. He has also been co-editor of the *European Journal of Political Research* and *Acta Politica*. Hans is a comparative political scientist in substance and method. His focus is on democracy and the role of social democracy.



**Danai KONSTANTINIDOU** has been a researcher at the European Social Observatory since October 2025. Her research focuses on social protection, poverty, welfare states, and comparative social policy and policy evaluation. She is in the final stage of her PhD in social policy at the University of York, where she examines the impact of social transfers on income poverty and deprivation in EU member states. **Mariana MAZZUCATO** (PhD) is Professor in the Economics of Innovation and Public Value at University College London (UCL), where she is Founding Director of the UCL Institute for Innovation & Public Purpose. She is the winner of international prizes including the Grande Ufficiale Ordine al Merito della Repubblica Italiana (2021), the 2020 John von Neumann Award, the 2019 All European Academies Madame de Staël Prize for Cultural Values and 2018 Leontief Prize for Advancing the Frontiers of Economic Thought. She is a member of the UK Academy of Social Sciences (FAcSS) and the Italian Academy of Sciences *Lincei*. In 2025, she was appointed Commander of the British Empire (CBE) in the King's Birthday Honours List. The late Pope Francis appointed her to the Pontifical Academy for Life for bringing "more humanity" to the world. She is the author of *The Entrepreneurial State: Debunking Public vs. Private Sector Myths*, *The Value of Everything: Making and Taking in the Global Economy*, *Mission Economy: A Moonshot Guide to Changing Capitalism* and most recently *The Big Con: How the Consulting Industry Weakens our Businesses, Infantilizes our Governments and Warps Our Economies*. She advises policymakers around the world on innovation-led inclusive and sustainable growth.



**Paul F. NEMITZ** is the chairperson of the Arthur Langerman Foundation at the Technical University of Berlin and a trustee of the Leo Baeck Institute, New York. He is a member of the board of Gegen Vergessen - Für Demokratie e.V. and the Committee for Media and Internet Policy of the SPD Board, Berlin. He is also chair of the Archivum Apertum Foundation and a member of the advisory board of the Future Institute of John Cabot University, Rome. He is also European Ambassador of the Boston Global Forum and Honorary Representative of the Free and Hanseatic City of Hamburg in Italy and to the Holy See.



**Alvaro OLEART** is a postdoctoral researcher at the Department of Political Science and the Institute for European Studies of the Université Libre de Bruxelles. His research focuses on the relationship between political conflict and democracy through a decolonial lens in the context of the EU, as well as on the relationship between national and European politics. He is author of the books *Framing TTIP in the European Public Spheres: Towards an Empowering Dissensus for EU Integration* (Palgrave, 2021) and *Democracy Without Politics in EU Citizen Participation: From European Demoi to Decolonial Multitude* (Palgrave, 2023).



**René REPASI** is a member of the European Parliament and head of the German delegation of the S&D Group. He also holds a position as Professor of Law at Erasmus University Rotterdam.



**Maria João RODRIGUES**, President of FEPS and former Portuguese minister to Prime Minister António Guterres, is a European politician with a long track record in all European institutions: EU presidencies; Council; European Council; European Commission; and, more recently, European Parliament. She played a relevant role in several big European initiatives: the EU growth and jobs strategy; the Lisbon Treaty; the Eurozone reform; the European Social Pillar; the interface with EU external strategic partners; and the Roadmap for the EU's future. Recently, she was vice-president of the S&D Group in the European Parliament, where she was in charge of the coordination of parliamentary work and interinstitutional negotiation on the EU agenda. As an academic, she is full professor and was the chair of the European Commission Board for socio-economic research. She has around a hundred publications and, as an expert and politician, has attended more than 2,000 conferences across Europe and the world.



**Eulalia RUBIO** is a senior research fellow on EU economic affairs at the Jacques Delors Institute in Paris and an associate senior research fellow in the Economic Policy Unit at the Centre for European Policy Studies in Brussels. She holds a PhD in political sciences from the European University Institute (Florence) and a master's degree in public policy from Universitat Pompeu Fabra (Barcelona). She has also served as an associate professor at the Department of Political and Social Sciences of Universitat Pompeu Fabra and at the European School of Political and Social Sciences in Lille.



**Maarten SMEETS** (PhD) is a senior associate at the Clingendael Academy (Den Haag, Netherlands), a non-resident senior fellow at the World Trade Institute (University of Bern, Switzerland), guest professor at the University of International Business and Economics (UIBE in Beijing and SUIBE in Shanghai, China), a member of the steering committee of the G-20 Trade and Investment Research Network (TIRN) and a lead on trade in the T-20 task forces (South



Africa, Brazil). As head of section at the WTO, he was responsible for all field-based trade capacity building programs and the WTO Chairs Program (WCP), linking over 40 universities, think tanks and leading academics worldwide. He is a senior policy advisor to WTO Chairs in Asia, Latin America and Africa, as well as to UNESCAP's Artnet. He advises governments on trade policies and offers training on WTO, trade negotiations and techniques. He was a senior official at the OECD's Trade Department and the Ministry of Economic Affairs (Den Haag). He has published work in leading journals and authored and (co-) edited books on current trade issues (digital trade, inclusive growth, globalisation, sanctions, WTO accession, structural reforms, developing countries). He holds a PhD from the Law Faculty of Maastricht University, a master's degree in economics (Tilburg) and degrees from the Graduate Institute for International Studies (Geneva) and the Ecole Nationale d'Administration (ENA-Paris).



**Slavina SPASOVA** has been Director of the European Social Observatory (OSE) since 1 December 2023 and holds a PhD in political science from the Université Libre de Bruxelles (ULB). She previously worked at OSE as a researcher and senior researcher, specialising in social protection. Her research covers pension reforms; protection for the self-employed; work-life balance; healthcare; long-term care; sickness benefits; and, more recently, the EU's demographic discourse and policy responses. She is a research associate at CEVIPOL (ULB), has been a member of the Strategic Council of the Institut d'études européennes, ULB, since 2024 and is a member of the editorial board of the *Journal of European Social Security*.



**Ania SKRZYPEK** (Skrzypek-Claassens) is FEPS Director for Research and Training. She holds a PhD cum laude in political sciences from the University of Warsaw, a degree which she obtained for her thesis "Cooperation of the socialist and social democratic parties in uniting Europe. From Liaison Bureau to PES. 1957-2007" (published in 2010). Before joining FEPS in 2009, Skrzypek worked as a PhD researcher and taught at the Faculty of Journalism and Political Sciences at the University of Warsaw (2003-2009). In parallel, she served as Secretary General of Young European Socialists for two consecutive terms (ECOSY, 2005-2009). She is an author of over 100 published pamphlets, papers and articles, available in English, German, French, Spanish, Bulgarian and Polish. **Mariola URREA CORRES** is Professor of International and European Union Law at the University of La Rioja. She has completed research assignments at the Europa Institute at the University of Saarbrücken, as well as at the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International Law in Heidelberg, Germany, and been a Jean Monnet Fellow at the European University Institute in Florence (Italy) and an Emile Noël Fellow at New York University (USA). Her academic publications

have focused, among other things, on the study of the mechanisms of differentiated integration provided within and outside the EU Treaties, as well as on the development of the legal instruments of the Union's security and defence policy. Since 2025, she has been a member of the scientific advisory board of the Max Planck Institute for Comparative Public Law and International Law of Heidelberg (Germany). Since 2007, she has been involved in radio and written press programmes in Spain, analysing the national and international political reality.



**Gesine WEBER** is a senior researcher in the Global Security team at the Center for Security Studies (CSS). Her research focuses on European security and defence in the context of global power shifts, grand strategy and Europe-China relations. Before joining CSS, she worked with the German Marshall Fund of the United States in Paris, at the Arnold A.
