Many NGOs, civil society organisations, humanitarian workers, lawyers, journalists and private citizens across Europe dedicated their time and skills to help people in need – a commitment our societies and governments should be proud of. In many European countries, however, humanitarian aid to refugees is increasingly portrayed in a negative light, if not openly criminalised. Individuals and CSOs who provide life-saving assistance, food, shelter, or run search-and-rescue operations in the deadly Mediterranean Sea, risk harassment, arrest and prosecution under the alleged crime of facilitating "unauthorised entry, transit or residence" in Europe.

In the documentary ***From compassion to crime***, Dutch director Stanzen Jelsma tells the stories of individuals who have faced or are still facing intense legal battles and criminal charges for showing compassion towards others.
