



Whose Youth? Far Right Youth Wings and the Challenge for Progressives

Description

What will the future of the far right look like? It is a question worth asking at a time when their rise in the polls and their dominance of national media discourse have become key characteristics of European politics. Characteristics that threaten to continuously undermine democratic standards and poison public debate.

What better way to tackle this question than by looking at the next generation of their leaders in the most systematic way possible? In this public event, Cas Mudde, one of the leading scholars on the far right, will present insights from a [new book](#) examining the youth wings of ten populist radical right (PRR) parties across Europe. Together with the author, we will dive into the key functions these youth wings fulfil for the radical right: mobilisation, socialisation, internationalisation, professionalisation, and normalisation. We will also discuss more broadly what they tell us about the present and future of the populist radical right.

Following the presentation, Cas Mudde will discuss the book with Mariam Asghari, Secretary General of the Young European Socialists, and Sabrina Repp, S&D MEP, before opening the conversation to the audience. Taking the analysis as its starting point, the discussion will shift attention to how far-right youth wings compare to progressive ones. Are they fishing in the same ponds for members? What are the key differences between them and social democratic youth movements? Where might strategies lie to strengthen progressive youth movements, and weaken far right ones?

About the speakers

Cas Mudde is Distinguished Research Professor of International Affairs at the University of Georgia. A leading scholar on the far right and populism, he is the author and co-author of several books, including, *The Far Right Today* and *Populism: A Very Short Introduction*.

Sabrina Repp is a Member of the European Parliament from Germany, sitting with the S&D Group for the SPD, where she serves on the Committee on Culture and Education and the Committee on Regional Development, and is a substitute member of the Committee on Women's Rights and Gender Equality. She was born in Rostock and elected to the European Parliament in 2024. She previously headed the constituency office of a Member of the Mecklenburg-Vorpommern state parliament and sits on the executive board of the European Movement Germany.

Mariam Asghari is Secretary General of the Young European Socialists (YES), the youth organisation of the Party of European Socialists. A long-standing activist in Sweden's Social Democratic Youth League (SSU), where she served on the national board, she has also been a Vice-President of the International Union of Socialist Youth (IUSY).
